Failed Rescue

Rescue workers try to push a stranded humpback whale back out to sea at Geriba beach in Buzios, 120 miles from Rio de Janeiro, on Oct. 26. The whales migrate north from Antarctica to mate from July to November off the coast of Brazil. This year, an unusually high number of whales have beached compared to last year. This whale could not be saved and died.

On This Day in History ~ November 1:

1512 - Michelangelo's paintings on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel were first exhibited to the public.

1800 - U.S. President John Adams became the first president to live in the White House.

1864 - The U.S. Post Office started selling money orders. The money orders provided a safe way to payments by mail.

1870 - The U.S. Weather Bureau made its first meteorological observations using 24 locations that provided reports via telegraph.

1940 - "A Night in the Tropics" was released. It was the first movie for Abbott and Costello.

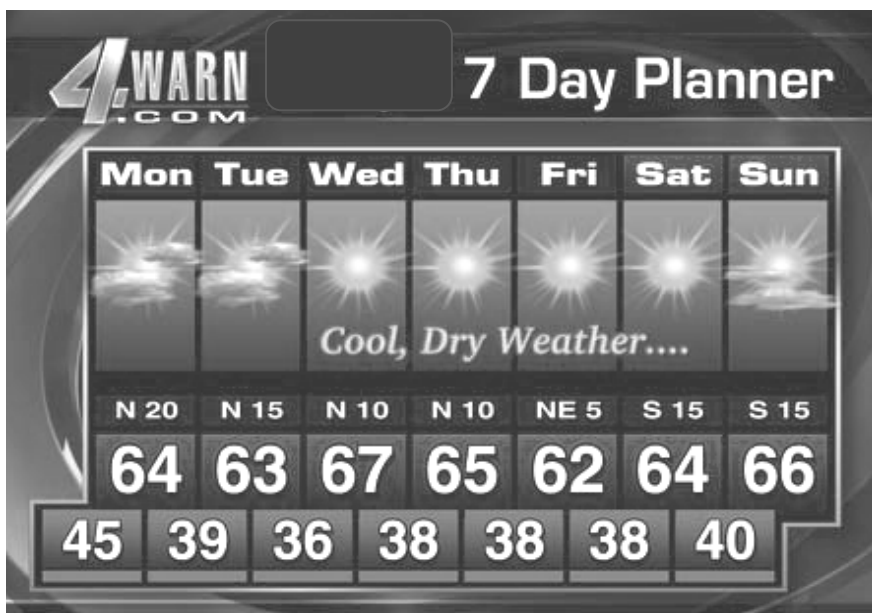
1950 - Charles Cooper became the first black man to play in the NBA.

1959 - Jacques Plante, Montreal Canadiens, became the 1st goalie in the NHL to wear a mask.

1962 - "The Lucy Show" premiered.

1968 - The movie rating system of G, M, R, X, followed by PG-13 and NC-17 went into effect.

1981 - The U.S. Postal Service raised the first-class letter rate to 20 cents.
