5. What do you call a snowman in July?

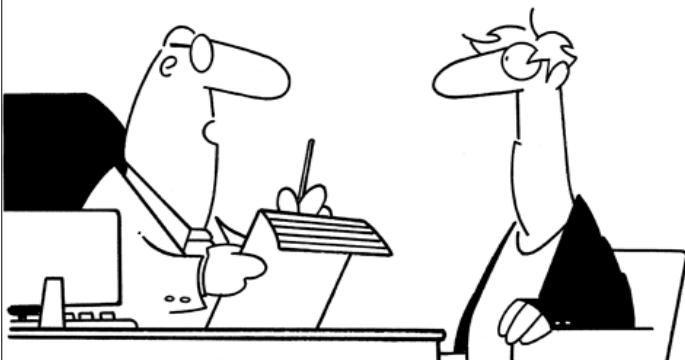

and I found myself a turkey who was sleeping on the ground.

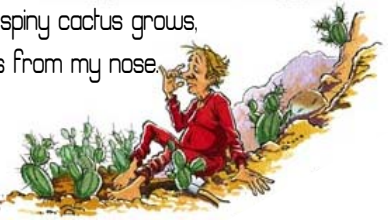
Chorus Turkey on the run. Turkey in the air.
